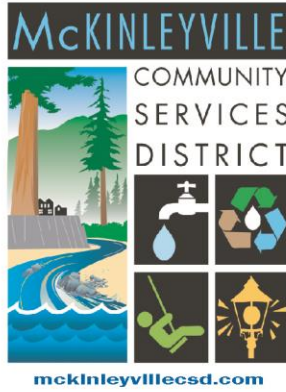

A Message from the General Manager

Here it is Spring again, we could use some rain, but it's hard to complain when the days are so nice. All the sunshine is also powering our Wastewater Management Facility! Not really (unless you want to talk about the thermal energy helping the bacteria to grow and consume more biomass) but it will soon! As shown in the photo below, we are making progress on the construction of the solar array for the Treatment Plant. This was funded by a grant/loan from a State Water Resources Control Board energy efficiency grant program. The solar array and batteries will form a microgrid that will be able to power the entire treatment plant. This will save the District roughly ten thousand dollars in electrical costs every month. These savings will convert into savings for all the rate payers. Construction is expected to be completed by this June.



In the Fall, I also mentioned the Statewide Park Development and Community Revitalization program grant application that the Parks & Rec. Department submitted for the development of a BMX track and park at School and Washington. As you have probably heard, and as further detailed in the Newsletter, we got that grant and will have a new BMX Park in McKinleyville! The park will also have a basketball court, pickleball court and a playground located in a park poor area of McKinleyville. As is obvious from the rest of this Newsletter, you have an amazing Parks & Rec staff working for you McKinleyville.

And the wins keep coming. We have heard that we were also successful in obtaining two additional Hazard Mitigation Grants from FEMA/CalOES to fund a redundant water mainline crossing of the

Mad River, and to replace two old redwood water tanks at the west end of Hewitt Drive. The main waterline from Humboldt Bay Municipal Water District crosses under the Mad River just downstream of the Highway 299 bridge and runs along North Bank Road to our Ramey Pump Station at North Bank and Azalea Ave. The crossing was installed in the early 1970's and is about 50-years old. This grant will allow us to put in a redundant, parallel water line that will replace the existing line when it fails. The redwood water tanks on Hewitt are also 50-years old, and the second grant will help to replace these tanks with larger steel tanks, that should be good for another 50 to 75-years. The District continues to be remarkably successful in getting grants to upgrade the aging water and sewer systems at minimal costs to the rate payers.

I should also probably tell you that we are going to be working on the replacement of the water and sewer mains along Central Avenue between Sutter and Hiller. You may have recently noticed surveyors and a drill rig along Central. These are part of the design process. We will be working on the design and bid packages this year and likely go to construction spring of 2023. I will start by thanking you all in advance for your patience with this work. We are going to try to replace them by bursting or lining the pipe to minimize the amount of Central that needs to be dug up. And we'll probably do a lot of the work at night to minimize traffic impacts, but again, thanks for your understanding!

I also want to note that the Community Forest acquisition is poking along, but we will be having our first Public Input Meeting on Saturday, February 26 from 9:30 to 12:30 at Azalea Hall. It will be a walking in format so you can come anytime and get information and provide input. We'll also be doing a Zoom version on March 8th from 6:00 to 7:30 pm. The focus of these meetings will be access points, so we can have that information to discuss Right-of-Way issues with Green Diamond before we acquire the property. We will however be happy to gather your input on other aspects of the Community Forest as well.

Prop. 68 Grant Award

Our Parks & Recreation Department was awarded a Prop. 68 Grant on December 8, 2021, which will provide \$2,331,375 to build a BMX Track and new Park on our Washington Property. This property is 3 acres in size and is located between Washington and School Roads (see the perimeter in the bird's eye view photo below).

The new park will have an inclusive playground, restrooms, outdoor basketball and pickleball courts, a parking lot and landscaping in addition to the BMX Track and concession stand.

This park is at the beginning stages of development and will have to go through a bid-proposal process for design and construction before breaking ground. This new park is expected to be completed before March of 2025.
