
A Message from the General Manager

"Everywhere is within walking distance if you have the time." - Steven Wright

I am writing this during the great break in our weather in January, and it feels like Spring is right around the corner. I sure hope it is. This break in the rain has been great for advancing the work on our 4.5MG Water Tank project. DN Tanks, the contractor building the tank, is done with the tank construction, and Mercer Fraser, the Prime Contractor, now is working on finalizing connecting the piping, backfill around the tank, and haul off the excess soil piled up. I love this accompanying picture from inside the tank as it looks like the inside of a pyramid or some ancient temple. We are hoping to have this project completed this spring. It will be good to have it done so we have extra water storage, but also because the next construction projects are already starting. A reminder that this tank project is grant funded from a FEMA/CalOES grant as well as a grant from the North Coast Resource Partnership

and the Department of Water Resources.

The BMX Park at School & Washington is trying to start. We are still working through the permitting with County Planning but also hope to have that done this Spring. We adjusted the start date for the Contractor to April 2, 2025. We hope that Spring is here by then and he can hit the ground running.

This is also a grant funded project from the State Natural Resources Agency, Prop 68 funding and will consist of the BMX USA certified track, a playground, a pickleball court, and a halfcourt basketball court. It will be a terrific addition to that area of town and to McKinleyville as a whole, if we can just get it built.

The Community Forest is also in full swing. There remains, and will remain for a long time, things to get done out there. We have a great bunch of talented McKinleyville community members along with District Staff working on it though. The overall Community Forest Committee

meets every third Tuesday of the month, at 5:30 at Azalea Hall. The Forest Management Plan Sub-committee meets on the first Tuesday of the month at 4:30 at the District office. The Trails Subcommittee meets on the fourth Tuesday of every month, at 5:15 at the District Office. I encourage you to stop by or listen in to those meetings if you are interested in what is happening. Each of those agendas, along with the Zoom links, are on our Website the Friday before each of those meetings. We will also be having Public Meetings to discuss certain topics, likely starting this summer, and we will advertise those well in advance.

We also received some incredibly good news from Congressman Huffman's office that we will be receiving grant funding for the replacement of our sewer mains that run under Highway 101! This is a \$5.1M grant that will replace these 50+ year old pipes. It is a much needed project and the grant will make it affordable without impacting sewer rates.

We are working on two other grant funded projects that are still in the design phase, the replacement of our water tanks at the west end of Hewitt and the rehabilitation of our main sewer lift station off Fischer Road. We continue to upgrade our infrastructure so it will last the next 100-years, at the lowest possible cost to the rate payers and have been lucky (and diligent) in getting these grant funds to offset costs.

Community Builder Award

The "Community Builder Award" is an award the District presents to local individuals, businesses, and organizations for their volunteer service, sponsorship, promotion of programs and events, outstanding service in the interest of the District, and for other contributions significant to McKinleyville's quality of life. District Staff has identified Mad River Rotary as a worthy recipient of the award for 2024 for the organizations dedication to serving and supporting the community.

The Mad River Rotary Club of McKinleyville was established in 1974. Since then, it has been a key partner with MCSD, the community of McKinleyville, Humboldt County, the State of California and the world. 


