A Message from the General Manager

"If you want the rainbow, you got to put up with the rain" – Steven Wright

It is amazing that winter is right around the corner. Meanwhile, I am going to enjoy these incredible fall days. Humboldt in September/ October is pretty tough to beat. The 4.5MG Tank project is also savoring these final days of fall before it starts raining. DN Tanks, the contractor building the tank is largely done with the tank construction, and Mercer Fraser, the Prime Contractor, now needs to connect up the piping, backfill around the tank, and haul off the excess soil piled up. The big red tower in the middle of the accompanying picture is wrapping "pre-stress" cable around the tank. The tank is wrapped in two layers of this cable, 27-miles total, stressed at 22,000 psi. This helps to ensure that the tank does not collapse during an earthquake. It will be good to have this project done (estimated for early 2025) so we have the extra water storage, but also because the next construction projects are already starting. A reminder that this project is grant funded from a FEMA/CalOES grant as well as a grant from the North Coast Resource Partnership and the Department of Water Resources.

The BMX Park at School & Washington is trying to start. We bid the project at the start of summer and the lowest, responsible bidder was F. Loduca Co. They started work this summer, then hit some County permitting snags, which we are working through. We hope to get back out there soon. This is also a grant funded project from the State Natural Resources Agency, Prop 68 funding and will consist of the BMX USA certified track, a playground, a pickleball court, and a halfcourt basketball court. It will be a great addition to that area of town and to McKinleyville as a whole, if we can just get it built.

The Community Forest is also in full swing. There remains, and will remain for a long time, things to get done out there. One of the first hurdles that we have gotten over though is the formation of the Community Forest Committee. We have a great bunch of talented McKinleyville Residents serving on the committee. These projects will hopefully go to construction in 2025 or 2026. We are also likely to get grant funding, but are waiting for the final confirmation for a redundant watermain under the Mad River from Humboldt Bay Municipal Water District, and the replacement of our sewer mains

that run under Highway 101. We continue to work on upgrading

our infrastructure to last the next 100-years, at the lowest possible cost to the rate payers.

McKinleyville Senior Center Expands Services and Engagement for Local Seniors

The McKinleyville Senior Center, a cornerstone of the community since its founding in 1980s, continues to provide vital services, activities, and support to local seniors. Nestled in the heart of McKinleyville, the center offers a welcoming space for older adults to socialize, engage in activities, and access resources that promote healthy aging.

In recent years, the center has seen a rise in participation and an expansion of its offerings, as more seniors seek out opportunities to stay active and connected. "Our goal is to ensure that seniors in our community have a place where they can come together, stay physically and mentally active, and feel a sense of belonging," said Scott Binder, the center's director.

Expanded Programs and Services

The McKinleyville Senior Center offers a variety of programs tailored to the interests and needs of its members. Popular classes include SAIL Fitness, tai chi, a TOPS Weight Loss program, and two walking groups, all designed to improve mobility and overall health. The center also offers computer and handheld device literacy training, one-onone, providing seniors with the skills to navigate the digital world and stay connected with loved ones online.

In addition to physical fitness, the center has ramped up its leisure time offerings. Monday cribbage, and twice-weekly Bingo and pinochle have been well-attended, as seniors seek to fill a vital need to socialize and engage in cognitive fitness. For those looking for creative outlets, their crochet and knitting



group offers a fun way to be productive, creative, and maintain dexterity.

Combatting Social Isolation

As social isolation among seniors becomes an increasing concern, the McKinleyville Senior Center has made it a priority to create opportunities for social engagement. Their open drop-in hours bring members together to forge friendships and stay socially active. Coming by to have a cup of coffee, a cookie or a slice of cake, or just to visit is exceptionally beneficial for a lonely senior. The Silver Quills Writing Group is also a wonderful gathering, where members congregate once monthly to share what they have written, hone their craft, and garner new ideas from others. "The friendships and sense of community that grow here are invaluable," said Dianne, a long-time member. "It's not just about the activities; it's about the

support we give each other."

Volunteer Opportunities and Community Involvement

The McKinleyville Senior Center thrives on the dedication of its volunteers, most of whom are seniors themselves. From running the front desk to teaching classes, volunteers play an integral role in the dayto-day operations of the center. In turn, the center provides volunteer opportunities that keep older adults engaged and contributing to their community. Their volunteers regularly attend monthly board meetings, where they learn from guest presentations from various supportive agencies and are then empowered to pass along more pertinent information.

The center also collaborates with local organizations to provide access to important services. Humboldt Senior Resource Center conducts a weekly frozen meal pop-up, Safeway donates bread and pastries thrice-weekly, flu and Covid vaccine clinics are conducted seasonally, online navigation services are regularly offered on-site (such as help with DMV online or TeleHealth), and many other resources can be made available depending upon their need. The center is also a member of the McKinleyville Chamber of Commerce, and recognizes the mutual benefits of collaborating with other local businesses so that all maintain strength.

Looking Ahead

As the senior population in McKinleyville continues to grow, the center will grow with them, expanding their services. For example, plans are underway to bring back VITA tax filing assistance for the upcoming tax season, among others. Fundraising efforts are always in progress, with the center relying on community donations and grants to support its goals. Although they enjoy space courtesy of MCSD, they are in fact a standalone 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and have significant expenses that need to be covered.

"We are so grateful for the community's support, and we are excited to continue growing and serving the needs of our seniors," said Binder. "Our seniors have given so much to this community, and now it's our turn to give back. After all, our motto is 'Sharing and Caring!'"

DID YOU KNOW...that the busiest day of the year for plumbers is the day after Thanksgiving? You might think this is due to an overuse of bathrooms from all the feasting, BUT actually is due to the way people clean-up the mess of cooking and feasting. The big dinners full of delicious animal fats and oils is too quickly washed down the drains of sinks where the grease then cools and bonds inside sewer laterals, which causes blockages which then leads to toilets not flushing and all kinds of grossness backing up out of household drains. The flow has nowhere to go except up and out where it came from. YOU can prevent this. Here are a few tips:

- Let the grease and oil from your feast preparations cool and then dispose of them in your garbage can.
- Wipe your greasy cook ware and plates with a paper towel before washing in the sink and dishwasher.
- Recycle your cooking oil by pouring into a jar or bottle after it has cooled for a future use.


Grease in the sewer main is costly as it requires additional work and can also cause your water and

Don't Touch That Angle Stop!!

So you need to do a little plumbing work on your house, but you quickly figure out that if you don't turn off the water, you'll end up wetter than you intended! You decide to turn off the water at the meter. How hard could it be, right? You go to your water meter and start to turn the angle stop....*snap*. You turn it left, then right – but it doesn't seem to be doing anything.

The next step is to call the water district for help, but you are given the following facts:

- 1. You've broken the angle stop.
- 2. The angle stop is District property.
- 3. You are now responsible for the substantial cost of repairing it.

Unfortunately, this story is all-too-familiar to us here at the District. The question is "What can you do instead?" First and foremost, do NOT attempt to operate the angle stop at the meter! This is District property and is only intended to be operated by trained District personnel.

Instead, please consider the following alternatives:

Do you have a well on the property? If so, the well is required to have a doublecheck valve. This valve has a component that allows you to turn off the water to everything past the check valve.

If the plumbing problem is inside the house, look for a shut-off valve at the base of your house. This is usually located below a hose-bib where your water line first meets your house.

If neither of those cases apply, call the District office during business hours (9:00 am – 5:00 pm Monday through Friday). The District staff will come out and turn the water off for you. The cost of this service (turning the water off and turning it back on when you are ready) is \$40 during business hours. After hours or on a weekend. the call-out charge is \$150. However, both charges are MUCH cheaper than the cost to repair a broken angle stop!

Looking to avoid the call-out charge in the future? We recommend that, while you are in plumbing repair mode with the water turned off, you also install a shut-off valve just past the meter on the customer (your) side. This will allow you to turn the water off yourself at any time without risking damage to the District's equipment.



We understand that any planned (or unforeseen!) circumstances that involve working on your home's water system can prove stressful. We here at McKinleyville Community Services District desire that work to go as smoothly for you as possible so please heed our warning. Give us a call if you need us...and don't touch that angle stop!




BMX Park Update

Melton Design Group completed the final construction bid documents, which were released on March 22, 2024. The lowest responsive bidder, F. Loduca Co., was awarded the contract at the June 5th Board Meeting. Tree work commenced on August 19. During the process of obtaining a Grading Permit, the contractor encountered additional requirements from County Building & Planning.

The first step was a General Plan Conformance review, which was successfully approved at the Planning Commission's hearing on September 19. We are now addressing final comments from the County Building Department and hope to begin construction soon.





McKinleyville Community Forest **Update: Committees**

MCFC- The purpose of the McKinleyville Community Forest Committee (MCFC) is to make recommendations to the McKinleyville Community Services District (MCSD) Board of Directors regarding plans, policies, programs, and projects relating to McKinleyville Community Forest. The MCFC is comprised of forest and natural resource professionals, District staff, local tribal representatives as well as members of the McKinleyville public in service to the planning, development, and management of the Community Forest. MCFC public meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month.

Subcommittees- Two subcommittees have been formed in addition to the MCFC in order to focus on specific aspects of the Community Forest. These are the Forest Management Plan/Funding/Budget (FMPFB) Subcommittee and the Trails Plan/Infrasture/Clean Ups/Security (TICS) Subcommittee.

PARC & MCFC Subcommittee Vacancies

Have you ever thought about serving your community in an official capacity? The Park And Recreation Committee (PARC) currently has one alternate member vacancy. Park And Recreation Committee members serve the McKinleyville Community Services District, through providing insight, input and recommendations to the MCSD Board of Directors on policies, programs and projects relating to McKinleyville's parks, facilities, open spaces and recreation activities. Current projects that the PARC members are discussing include the BMX track development, improvements to the Community Garden at Pierson Park, the expansion and renovation of Pierson Park to include the Skate Park Phase 2. If you have expertise or interest in the areas of recreation, parks, open space and natural resource management, marketing and/or any of the specific projects currently under discussion, please consider joining the PARC.

The committee meets once per month, on the third Wednesday of the month from 6:30pm-8:00pm. The meetings are held in person at the MCSD office, and are available for members of the public to attend via Zoom. The recently formed McKinleyville Community Forest Committee (MCFC) has established two Subcommittees: the Forest Management Plan and Funding/Budget (FMPFB) Subcommittee and the Trails Plan/Infrastructure/Clean Ups/Security (TICS) Subcommittee. At this time there are five open seats on the FMPB Subcommittee and we are accepting applications. Currently there are 7 applicants for the 5 seats on the TICS Subcommittee. These applications will be reviewed by the MCF Committee at the October 15 MCFC Meeting, at which time the committee will select up to 5 of the applicants to recommend to the MCSD Board of Directors to appoint to the TICS Subcommittee.

The FMPFB Subcommittee meets on the first Tuesday of the Month at 4:30pm at the MCSD Office. The TICS Subcommittee meets on the forth Tuesday at 5:00pm at the MCSD Office.
